1982. John Hinckley, who shot US President Ronald Regan in March 1981, is found not guilty of attempted murder by reason of insanity.

» NEW HOSPITAL
1996. Construction begins after the foundation stone for the new Tan Tock Seng Hospital is laid. It will cost about \$600 million to build the hospital, which will stand at the junction of Moulmein and Thomson roads.
