The second Keppel Community Golf Festival took place in July at Keppel Club, a six-day event involving golfers, community groups and visitors through clinics, competitions, games and entertainment. Many participants experienced golf for the first time through guided sessions at the driving range, putting green and simulator. The festival also saw the launch of SGS ONE through a partnership with SAFRA Golfing Section, supporting more opportunities for people to learn, play and connect through golf.



Strength Beyond Cancer

Eight-year-old Yiyi took centre stage at Hair for Hope 2026 on 27 July, where the Children's Cancer Foundation (CCF) shared her journey. Diagnosed with a brain tumour at the age of four, Yiyi lost vision in one eye and has limited sight in the other after treatment. Through a video shown from her perspective, visitors experienced some of the daily challenges she faces, from navigating spaces to adapting in school. The initiative helped raise awareness of the lasting effects of childhood cancer and the ongoing support children and families need.
